The African School of Economics (ASE), which opened in the academic year 2014-2015 in Benin, aims at promoting cutting-edge academic research and training in the social sciences and management in Africa. ASE is an extension of the Institute for Empirical Research in Political Economy (IREEP / IERPE), and was founded by Dr. Leonard Wantchekon, Professor of Politics and Economics at Princeton University.

ASE invites applications from qualified individuals with strong research and teaching interests for a full-time position in Economics at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full Professor, appointment to commence September 2016. Duties include teaching business administration courses mostly in the Master in Business Administration (MBA) program but occasionally in the Master in Mathematics Economics and Statistics (MMES) program. The subfield is open but we encourage candidates with teaching experience in Development Economics, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Econometrics, Political Economy, Agricultural Economics and Labor Economics to apply. Additional responsibilities include university and community service, engaging in active scholarly research and consulting on projects with ASE's Institute for Empirical Research in Political Economy (IERPE).

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: Submissions must include (1) a cover letter, (2) two sample publications, (3) statement of teaching philosophy, (4) curriculum vitae, (5) three reference letters, and (6) official transcripts for all post-secondary education.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants for an Assistant Professor position must have a Ph.D. in Economics or Finance (or a related discipline) or have a Ph.D. in hand by May 2016. Applicants for an Associate/Full position must also have an emerging or developed scholarly reputation. We are interested in individuals with excellent research skills.
